REGISTRATION FOR SPRING PROGRAMMING OPENS MONDAY, MARCH 6, 2017

(Charleston, WV) – The First Tee of West Virginia is once again offering young people, ages 5-18, of all backgrounds an opportunity to develop, through golf and character education, life-enhancing values such as honesty, integrity and sportsmanship.

The Life Skills Experience is one of the unique features that separates The First Tee program from all other junior golf programs. The Life Skills Experience is used to further enhance and instill the inherent values of the game of golf and teach participants how these values transfer into other aspects of their lives. These lessons for life are learned through a variety of golf-related activities with the primary goal of having fun. Participants learn about themselves and others through a range of experiences enhancing their golf skills and fundamental values for life. As opportunities on the golf course expand so do the opportunities for the rest of their lives.
